Recycling is easier and more convenient for Northfield Township Residents. The Northfield Township Road District garage doors are open as a recycling center from Monday thru Friday, between the hours of 7 AM until 3 PM. For the 2018 season excluding holidays, the drop-off will start Monday, April 2nd at 7AM and end on Friday, November 2nd at 3PM. Please pull up to the front of the garage building at 1928 Lehigh in Glenview, ring the bell and we will help you take the recyclable material out of your car. Please see the following list of materials that the Road District will accept for recycling.

ITEMS ACCEPTED

- Art supplies,
- Batteries (*all types*),
- Bikes & Toys (*usable condition*),
- Cardboard (*all boxes must be flattened NO CARDBOARD TUBES ACCEPTED*),
- Cell Phone/Pagers,
- Clothing (*usable condition*),
- Computer Hardware (*NO COMPUTER MONITORS ACCEPTED*),
- Electronics,
- Engine Oil (*no vegetable or peanut oil*),
- Eyeglasses,
- Fluorescent tubes/bulbs,
- Ink toner cartridges,
- Metal,
- Styrofoam, (*only clean, white Styrofoam blocks can be accepted, please do not bring cups, food trays, foam sheeting or peanuts*),
- Tires (*limit of 4 Tires – no tractor, large equipment or commercial tires accepted*),
- Transmission fluid,
- Flags,
- Small electronics,
- Therapeutic equipment (*canes, crutches, standers, walkers, wheelchairs*),
- Household paint (*oil & latex, limited to 10 one gallon cans or 2 five gallon buckets*)

THE NORTHFIELD TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT IS NOT A DUMP. WE ONLY TAKE THE ITEMS LISTED ABOVE. WHEN THIS FACILITY IS CLOSED, NO ITEMS SHOULD BE LEFT ON THE PREMISES. WE WILL WRITE A TICKET AND FINE INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE RECORDED DUMPING. In addition, our partnership with the Village of Northbrook provides an additional opportunity to recycle with an added drop-off location in Northbrook. The Village of Northbrook (www.northbrook.il.us) will be receiving at the garage behind the Village Hall on Cedar. Check the Village's web site to verify the times, dates and list of accepted recyclables.

2018 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE PROGRAM

Since the majority of hazardous materials used in homes today can be either recycled, reused, or can be safely destroyed, Northfield Township Road District Highway Commissioner Tim Rueckert has again entered into an agreement with Heritage Environmental Services to create a limited Household Hazardous Waste Program for our homeowners in Northfield Township to safely dispose of their unwanted household cleaning and maintenance products.

Our HHW program is a way in which we can offer homeowners of Northfield Township an alternative to disposal of the chemicals in a landfill. The Road District has made it simple. **From 7AM to 3PM on June 2, August 4 and October 27**, Northfield Township residents can drop off accepted household chemical waste at 1928 Lehigh Avenue in Glenview. ***We will be checking identification.***

The following items will be accepted: *antifreeze, cleaning products that are consumer commodities only, charcoal lighter fluid, driveway sealer (limit of 2 five gallon buckets), drain cleaners, paint thinners and gasoline in approved/original containers only, insecticides and herbicides.*

- No medical waste of any kind
- No propane cylinders of any size
- No items containing Mercury
- No pool chemicals
- No business/commercial waste accepted
- All items must be in original containers

At the collection site, Road District employees will help unload cars, segregating and repackaging the waste. The waste is prepared for shipment, ensuring all DOT and EPA regulations are met. The material is then transported to the Heritage Environmental Services facility for proper disposal/recycling.

How to Dispose of Medicines Properly

DON'T flush expired or unwanted prescription and over-the-counter drugs down the toilet or drain unless the label or accompanying patient information specifically instructs you to do so.

DO return unwanted or expired prescription and over-the-counter drugs to a drug take back program. The Village of Glenview accepts them from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the first Friday of the month (except when rescheduled because of a holiday), and the Glenview Police Department hosts a drug take-back day, which includes controlled substances, typically in the spring and fall.

DO return unwanted or expired prescription and over-the-counter drugs to a safe medication disposal site:

- **The Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago's O'Brien facility** at 3500 Howard St, Skokie 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. seven days a week
- The Cook County Sheriff's Office Prescription Drug Take-Back-Program has boxes at the Skokie Courthouse, 5600 Old Orchard Road.

PRESCRIPTION DRUGS AND/OR SHARPS DISPOSAL

Should you have unneeded prescriptions or used sharps, the following programs ensure that medicines don't end up harming our children or in our water supply and that sharps are disposed of safely.

Incorporated Glenview Residents Only

Drop off is at the Village Hall, 2500 East Lake Avenue, on the first Friday of every month between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. No controlled substances or narcotics are accepted.

Incorporated Northbrook Residents Only

Drop-off is at The Northbrook Police Department, 1401 Landwehr Road. Please bring your medications to the Records or Communication desk. Accepted items include: prescription medications, controlled substances, vitamins and medicated ointments on a 24/7 basis. No sharps or liquids are accepted.

Recycling Mandates From the State of Illinois

The State of Illinois has mandated that, effective January 1, 2012; certain electronics may no longer be disposed of in landfills. Therefore, beginning January 1, all residents in the State of Illinois will no longer be able to place any of the following electronic products in their refuse or recycling for disposal:

- Televisions
- Digital video disc recorders
- Monitors
- Digital converter boxes
- Printers
- Satellite receivers
- Computers
(*including tablet computers*)
- Cable receivers
- Electronic keyboards
- Electronic mice
- Facsimile machines
- Scanners
- Videocassette recorders
- Small scale servers
- Portable digital music players
- Video game consoles
- Digital video disc players
